Plant Spotlight:

The Bleeding Heart By Jackie Weiss Garden Center Manager

DICENTRA SPECTABILIS

More commonly known as the Bleeding Heart, it is an old fashioned perennial loved by plant enthusiast all over. This beauty gets its name from the pretty heart shaped flowers that appear in early to mid spring and can sometimes last into mid summer. Bleeding Hearts will likely go dormant during the summer so be sure to plant with Hosta and Ferns so that you don't have an empty space in your garden. It can reach sizes of 3 feet tall and wide. and does best in a shady spot, but can tolerate some sun when mixed with other plantings. Flower colors are pink, white, and red.





Mr. Smarty Plants

Pear Mr. Smarty - I am anxious to get my Spring pruning done early. I am new to gardening, can you get me started? - signed, Ready to get growing

Dear Ready: Sure! But first, do your homework before the Spring rush. Read about pruning times for the shrubs and trees you'll work with. There are many reasons to prune. Decide if you are pruning to rejuvenate an old plant for new growth, trim for shape, salvage a damaged plant, or simply promote new blossoms.

Branches and limbs that appear dead, may actually not be. Live branches are limber, whereas dead ones are brittle and break. Start by sampling a small section of bark which may reveal active green growth beneath. Delay most pruning chores until just before the end of dormancy. You don't want to disrupt a plant's internal chemical messengers which signal it to grow as the weather warms. Try to reduce moisture loss at cutting wound points. This is important to the survival of new growth during late Spring. Cells don't normally form scar tissue over pruning cuts made in Winter. In warmer weather, however, healing occurs quicker, as active growth returns during the seasonal cycle. Slope cuts so snow melt and rain water will drain off. Don't use tree paint or wound sealer, as they don't promote wound closure or prevent decay. Reserve them for use on cuts for branch diameters larger than 2 or 3 inches.

Juniper are best pruned in late Winter, just prior to Spring warming. Other needled evergreens and conifers prefer very early Summer for maintenance pruning. They usually only produce one flush of new growth. Plants that will tolerate dormant pruning are: Smoke Tree, some Summerblooming Hydrangea varieties, some Rose varieties, and Cotoneaster. Recent findings indicate that dormant pruning of Oak trees during Winter helps to greatly reduce Oak Wilt believed to be spread by fungus carried by insects during warmer weather.

Not all trees and shrubs can endure severe removal of excessive growth. Many prefer gradual rejuvenation, called "renewal pruning", done over 2-3 years. Those that can tolerate hard pruning are: Hydrangea, Lilac, Forsythia, multi-branched Dogwoods; some Spirea, Weigela, and Potentilla. Purple Sand Cherry, Burning Bush, Viburnum, and Witchazel like a gradual trim. Spring blooming items are best left alone until after flowering completes. Early pruning can reduce their display. For fun, try forcing some branches of these like: Forsythia, flowering Quince, flowering Almond, or Redbud. Non-traditional shrubs can be forced too. Red Twig Dogwood, Hickory, Cherry, European Birch, Peach, or Red Maple will produce surprising and unique results. Forcing not only provides colorful enjoyment out of season, but gives insight into what you might like to plant next when the weather warms. Signed, Mr. Smarty Plants
