Trends, however according to the Society of American Florists (SAF) of which Linton's faithfully supports is a member, states that trends do not cycle world-wide, but in gradual shifts of public awareness and acceptability.

Noticable trends with Linton's customers is the acceptance and use of 'neutral grays" mixed with numerous shades of lavish colors such as rhubarb, purple or aqua. Trending might also see bringing back brushed gold metal, vintage milk glass and mercury glass.

Wedding floral selections often incorporate Dusty Miller and succulents. As far as newer florals, Anenome and Ranunculus are both at the top of some bride's lists.

Good news comes from our U.S. growers in that the beautiful Sweet Pea, sent to us from Japan, is now available with a much anticipated long stem. Look soon for these beauties to be placed along with other lengthy stemmed flowers in tall vase.

Garden favorites include the colorful Dahlia which are available in almost every imaginable color and sizes ranging from a quarters sized ball to a dinner plate.

No longer to be seen as only a part of Christmas decor, decorative lanterns, with or without candles are enjoyed renewed popularity. Lanterns, as found at Linton's are available in sizes from 4 inches to 40 inches tall. Colors, as well as metallics, also include natural and distressed wood. BUTTERFLY BUSHES are a great addition to any garden or landscape. They are prolific growers. Growing 6 or more feet in one season. But, don't worry there are several dwarf varieties as well. They come in a range of colors from white, yellow, pink, magenta pink, light purple to dark purple. They have a wonderful fragrance that butterflies, Goldfinches, and humans alike are attracted to. Butterfly Bushes should be cut back to 8-12" late fall after they have gone dormant.

# **Mr. Smarty Plants**

#### Dear Mr. Smarty Plants,

This year we would like to add more color into our outdoor living space. Fragrance would be nice too. What would you suggest?

-Signed, Wondering what to do

Dear Wondering Gardener, What a "wonder" ful idea! Breathe a breath of fresh air into your yard with the aid of a professional designer. Start by making a list of outdoor items you would like to keep and that are already in your yard. Then, shop Linton's Garden Centre, to create your wish list. Our professional designers are knowledgeable about the plants' light, soil type, moisture and nutritional needs. They will also know which plants make good companions to fit into the space you have, from postage-stamp sized yards to those with room-to-roam.

For color, explore shrubs that have interesting colored foliage. Keep in mind that flowering varieties put on their show for a limited time, whereas leaves remain through frost. Explore these focal -point shrubs for starters: Smokebush - blue green or maroon/ purple, will display reds, oranges, and yellows in Fall. Care-free Native Ninebark comes in chartreuse, bronze, green, or purple tones. Old time traditionals like Burning Bush (red in Fall), compliment plants and perennials of contrasting colors. For something that will show up in shady, dark spots; Hydrangea offers chartreause varieties and variegated foliage. Smaller colorful accents include: Huerchera, Japanese Painted Fern, some smaller grasses, and many shades of blue and green Hosta.

When shopping for fragrance, pay attention to bloom times to keep stronger scents from clashing. This will also provide delightful, olfactory variety as the growing season progresses. Lightly pleasant fragrances are produced from re-blooming Mock Orange, or try Korean Spice Viburnum (turns wine red in Fall), and dwarf Korean Lilac. Many perennials and herbs produce fragrance from their leaves. Rugosa and old-fashioned Roses have withstood modern breeding and still retain their genes for original scent. Dianthus 'Tiny Rubies', summer Phlox, Peonies, and old Fashioned Petunias have their own unique scents as well. Can't wait and want both instant color and perfume? Try containerized annual flowers and scented candles! There are many ways to enjoy both. Have fun in planning.
