hues of plum, gold and burgundy! Fall blooming perennials such as Toad Lilies, Sedums, and Russian Sage are all great ways to add and additional splash of color! Coral Bells and Dwarf Sedge grasses do a great job maintaining their colors even after frost, and add a pop of color throughout the fall and even into the winter months. Winter pansies can be planted early fall as a cool season annual, and their flowers are a sure way to put smiles on everyone's face! And don't forget ornamental grasses! Blue Oat Grass, Blue Fescue and Blue Dune grasses are the perfect way to add some blue tones to the landscape. I particularly love to plant them along with the golden evergreens and Burning Bush for a nice contrast of colors.

Terrariums are the perfect fall and winter projects for those who loves to garden! They are fun and easy to make. First, select a container-any clear, container will work. A glass vase, a glass jar, a drinking glass, a fish tank, or even a hanging ornament. Make sure it's big enough to show off the plants and a decoration or two. After selecting your container, place a thin layer of sand or pea gravel in the bottom to allow for drainage. Then place a layer of Activated Charcoal to prevent smells. The next layer is sphagnum peat which prevents the soil from sifting through. Finally your soil. If you are using houseplants stay with a potting mixture. If you choose a cactus or succulent you'll want to use a sandy cactus soil.

Now comes the fun part-the plants! Some great terrarium-worthy choices are Prayer Plant, Pepperomia, Begonia, smaller leaved Ficus, and succulents. Be sure to include mosses as well. Don't forget to add a bit of personal flair with some decoration. Fairy garden or miniature décor is an excellent way to add some whimsey and interest

Water your terrarium sparingly and set it in a sunny window, but out of the direct sunlight. Your terrarium will naturally retain water, so check before watering. As plants grow you may want to change them out for new ones.

Mr. Smarty Plants

Pear Mr. Smarty Plants, Please provide a few tips for flowers and trees in the Fall garden.

Signed - Falling in Love with Autumn

Fall is a great time to plant trees. Deciduous trees begin the process of dormancy with the onset of lower soil and air temperatures. They will require less watering in Fall, rather than in the hotter days of Summer. Roots can continue to grow even when leaves have droped off, so planting now is alright. Use larger caliper trees with ½″-3″ diameter trunk sizes, for greater success. Conifers and needle bearing trees are tougher breeds. Most only require attention to watering in the weeks before the ground freezes. Steer clear of last minute fertilizing which would promote new, tender growth. Planting instructions or professional installation are both advisable.

Perennials should be trimmed back - removing browned and dried leaves, but showy flower stems can remain to provide seeds for wildlife to eat and to catch snow later on. They mark the plant's location, and are removed in Spring with the arrival of new growth. Remove any Annual flowering plants to avoid pests and diseases from staying around.

For Water Gardens, look for signs of decline in your potted and floating water plants. Most likely, you'll notice fading of green coloration in leaves and stems as the weather gradually cools. Begin preparation for storage by clearing space in a semi-darkened area that does not freeze over Winter. Trim back any browned leafy material, and relocate containers and bulbs to a low rubberized tub of clean sand. The sand will hold water during the dormant period and will also be absorbed through the holes in container bottoms. You can check on your sleeping plants to make sure they do not dry out.

Fall leaf collection can provide fun for all ages. Beautifully colored, freshly fallen leaves can easily be preserved. Gently press them between 2 sheets of waxed paper, weighted down with a stack of old magazines. A few days later, gently peel back the waxed paper. There should be a slight coating of wax on the leaves, which provides temporary preservation of the leaf color. To extend your garden, Sun catchers or patterned sweatshirts and tees can be made from tracings of the pressed leaves.
