all is a great time to evaluate your landscape and determine what worked well and what didn't work well and to see if anything is lacking. When I am re- designing a landscape I start out walking the property with my clients and determine what is adding beauty, and what no longer is beautifying the residence. My personal test is that if a plant, tree or shrub is no longer adding any beauty, then it is time for it to go. A common problem here in Michiana is that when our DIY quests visit our Home and Garden Centre they immediately fall in love with anything that is in bloom and is in their full glory. Unfortunately, there are very few landscape plants which provide non-stop color all three seasons. I always recommend that our quests visit our Garden Centre once each season so that they will have a constant display of color! I also feel that a landscape is fluid and is always changing, and many times simply dividing and transplanting, as well as thinning out perennials and ornamental grasses will immediately freshen up the landscape.

Another trick of mine is to simply enlarge the planting bed to allow for more room as the landscape plants grow. If the plantings are growing out over the edging it makes the landscape look tired, but by expanding the beds it freshens up the landscape and adds on more years of use to the landscape!

Another challenge that I run across quite frequently, is that here in Michiana our colorful plants, trees and shrubs all loose their leaves in the fall, and many landscapes are simply a display of branches, twigs and sticks, providing absolutely no beauty throughout the late fall, winter, and early spring. And here in Michiana, that's a total of six months!!! It's extremely important to

incorporate plenty of evergreens to add beauty during the nonflowering seasons. 

The end of the growing season usually goes out with a big bang of highly anticipated powerful pops of color. The many tones of red, russet, oranges and yellows can be breath taking indeed! Fall annuals and perennials can help boost this already great spectacle that we have come to adore. Ice pansy is a hardy flower that can be planted in the fall which will then over winter and bloom again in the spring. They come in many shades from pink to white to deep purple. Just like their spring cousin they love the cool weather. Flowering cabbage and flowering kale are ornamental version of the edible crop you find in the vegetable garden. These grow in a similar manner but have incredible layers of color in tones of purple, green, white and pink. Last but not the least are hardy chrysanthemums. These beauties are by far the most popular fall perennial to add to a landscape for faithful splashes of long lasting color. Be sure to plant them early and mulch them in after the ground freezes for year after year of fall beauty.
