How To Prepare Your Garden For Fall & Winter

- Remove pumps from fountains and ponds cover fountains to avoid cracks
- Prune any deciduous shrubs that bloom in summer (If you prune spring bloomers now they will not blossom next spring)
- Don't cut back Knock-Out Roses, Evergreens or Ornamental Grasses until early spring
- Cut down any perennials that are brown
- Keep watering evergreens until the ground freezes
- Rake up leaves of plants that have fungus and destroy them (don't compost them)
- Remove any annual bulbs (calla lilies, cannas, gladiolas, etc.) for winter storage
- Mulch more heavily around your tender perennials and shrubs for greater protection. Place a sheet or landscape fabric around the plant, then place mulch on top. Spring clean-up will be much easier!
- Japanese Maples planted in a windy site will need a wind break to protect it. Place 2 stakes in the ground 18" apart, then stretch a pillow case over the stakes. This slows down the wind and

- Stake newly planted trees so winter winds do not blow them over.
- If you have winged cress in your lawn, this is the season to take action. Their seeds germinate under the snow. To prevent germination, place a crab grass preventer/pre-emergent on your lawn in late fall or early winter.



MR. SMARTY PLANTS

Dear Mr. Smarty Plant:

My garden is really dried out, and winter is coming. I'm afraid my trees and shrubs will dry out even more or die. Anything I should be doing to prepare? - signed Parched

Dear Parched,

Symptoms of drought stress take many forms. Leaves or needles may wilt, turn brown, or dry up. Yellowing or reddish tones, if not the plant's usual fall colors, can be another sign. Stunted growth and disfigurement might also occur. Dessication (dehydration) is evident from the top of the plant downward. Make notes on the drought stressed items for further observation during mid-winter warm-ups. Water moderately until the ground freezes and during winter warm-ups. You will also want to apply a product such as Wilt Stop to evergreens, according to package directions, to hold moisture in the leaves and protect them from winter winds.

Increase mulch in areas under trees, making a depth of 3-4" before winter to retain moisture. But plan to remove some of the mulch in spring. Remember, plants & trees become susceptible to pests and diseases during and after times of stress.

Help Save Mother Earth

Every year millions of nursery pots are used just once and then hauled away to the landfill. By recycling and re-using the pots, we can all do our part to help Mother Earth. For each used black plastic nursery pot (1 gallon or larger) returned to us, Linton's will reward you with a credit of 5 cents per container. And we don't mind if the container was purchased elsewhere. (We also recycle glass floral vases too!) Note: Pots must be in relatively good condition and without labels.



- Wind & Willow Greek Feta & Olive Cheeseball Mix (reserve ½ for garnish)
- 1-1/2 cups uncooked pasta (bow tie, shells, or your favorite)1 cup halved grape tomatoes
- l cup ripe olives (sliced or whole pitted
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 1/4 cup olive oil
 1 Tbsp balsam
 - Tbsp balsamic vinegar
- l cup cooked chicken, but into bite-sized pieces

Cook pasta according to package directions; drain. In large mixing bowl, mix pasta with $\frac{1}{2}$ the Greek Feta & Olive mix & all remaining ingredients. Toss gently to coat. Garnish with remaining topping. Serve warm or chill to serve cold.

Optional additions: marinated artichoke hearts, feta cheese, shredded Parmesan or cubed mozzarella.
