Bright colors are typical of this daisy-like flower with sizes ranging from quarter to coffee cup size. Colors are often multi-shades- varying from chartreuse/lime accented with brilliant tangerine as well as "perky pink" with "hot lips" fuschia. Some varieties might include a "center black eye" to contrast with a vivid crested double row of short and long over-lapping petals. Various shades of pink as seen in the Spring garden, mixed with fresh yellows and, of course, green make a powerful statement when displayed inside the home.

Novelty varieties are really eye-catching and, even if your favorite dress color is not a part of the selection, you might consider contacting one of Linton's flower tinting professionals! Summer Heat and Humidity

Summertime heat and humidity can be stressful on plants as well as humans. High humidity and hot conditions can cause many problems in the plant world.

Fungus diseases are one of the worst problems for plants in the summertime. One way to avoid this is to not water plants from overhead. Wet leaves are a breeding ground for fungus. Also, avoid watering at night. Plants should be dry as night falls. Additionally, mulching too deeply also can cause fungus growth, since the mulch stays wet. Ideally, you should spread mulch about 2-3 inches deep, and just a very thin layer at the base of each plant or shrub.

Mr. Smarty Plants

Mr. Smarty Plants Dear Mr. Smarty Plants, Years ago, our new house came with a tiny patio as a contractor "perk". Since then, our family and our needs have grown. We'd like to use the space more, but it just does not work. Any ideas? -Signed: Growing Family

Dear Family: Why not expand your couples' patio into something you all can enjoy. Begin by addressing any drainage issues that may be occurring around foundations and downspouts in the immediate area. New hard surfaces affect rainfall penetration and run-off, so problems must be fixed before your begin.

Make a list of your "use needs" and number of people you would like to accommodate. Observe the flow pattern to the yard from the existing patio. Planned paths and step pads will help reduce soil compaction and lawn disturbance from foot traffic and pets.

You don't always have to tear out what you already have. Pint-sized patios can be extended to maximize function to square footage, with like or complimentary materials built in an artful design.

Are wind, shade, or too much sun a consideration? Alter the environment if you don't have much flexibility in your site location. Professional landscapers can offer solutions with suitable plants and trees, arbors, pergolas, bench seatwalls and screening. They will also know the local codes, restrictions, & ordinance requirements and can give you the best design for your budget.

For evening use, include lighting for safety and the desired atmosphere. Enjoy friendly fireside conversation? A stone firepit will bring out the warm interaction you may be seeking. Night gardens can also be planted in flower beds or raised gardens which surround your beautiful new patio.
