ASK IRIS!

Dear Iris,

What should I be doing for my yard in the winter months? I didn't really like what I had this year, and some things I tried just did not work out. Where do I go from here?

Dear All Frozen Up,

Spend the really nice, clear fall days outside studying your yard. Take down notes about what you'd like to keep and what you would like to see changed. Remember to jot down flower colors of perennials and shrubs you would like to see remain. Do you want to add a retaining wall or hardscape such as a patio or deck? Maybe you have a special event coming up where it would be beneficial to have one. All of this information will aid designers later on.

Then get ready to be 'snowed in' this winter. Head to your local library in late fall. Start browsing magazines and those "idea" books to gain inspiration, and get an idea of the look you are after. Also think about what time of year you spend the most time out in your yard-spring, summer or fall? Are you outside mornings through evenings? This will obviously influence when you want it to look its best. Select your readings carefully too. You don't want to fall in love with a look that doesn't work well here in our northern climate. Keep this in mind as you curl up in front of that cozy fireplace with all those colorful references.

When you feel you have seen enough, make a list of maintenance issues you can live with. Be practical and honest in accessing your time and abilities. Too often, calendar perfect "dream gardens" turn out to be a nightmare for a homeowner who underestimated his or her endurance, time and skill level to do the installation and maintain the look. What looked great in a magazine or book, may have taken quite a lot of time in the design stage and was installed by seasoned professionals.

Once you've decided on your direction, study your finances. Many people are putting travel and gas money into the equity of the home landscaping instead. After all, most people spend a lot of time in their yards, or see them from indoor viewing points. You may decide that you need to do your project in stages, or perhaps save time and money doing it all in one construction session. If you still don't know what you want or how to begin, winter is the best time to consult a professional landscape designer and contractor. Bear in mind that spring may come quickly, and they will get busy very fast! I guarantee that you will be glad you started earlier during the design and thought phase. And don't forget that spring can be just as unpredictable as to when it makes its appearance You have to wait until the ground thaws to see your dreams sprout form the drawing plan to planting in the ground.

Yes you can! I am always amazed by the number of people, even avid outdoor gardeners, that are unwilling to try houseplants. Why? Because they're hard? They're dirty? Houseplants can be very easy with a little help from us.



Let me tell you some of the benefits of houseplants. They can actually help clean pollutants from the air in your home, especially new homes that tend to be more air tight for energy efficiency. They scrub significant amounts of harmful gases out of the air and place them in their soil where they can do no harm to anyone. They are mood enhancing. As you care for your plant, your blood pressure and stress level become reduced and a calming feeling relaxes your body. Houseplants can also help fight fatique and colds by increasing the humidity level in the home and decreasing dust. And most of all, they're just plain beautiful to look at.

When choosing a houseplant start out simple. If you are a very busy person, and you choose a variety that requires 1 hour a day of care rather than a plant that needs only 5 minutes a week, you just set yourself up to fail at growing houseplants. Start out with some simple, easy to grow varieties such as Ivy, Spider Plant, Peace Lily, Palms, Ficus, Philodendrons, Tillandsia or a Mother-in-lawtongue. After you have had success with some of these varieties and you feel more comfortable, graduate to more exotic and touchy species of houseplants

What's Cooking?

Chocolate Mint Truffles

1 3/4 c (11.5oz pkg) milk chocolate morsels 1 c (6 oz) semi-sweet chocolate morsels 3/4 c heavy whipping cream

1 tbsp peppermint extract

1 ½ c finely chopped walnuts, toasted, or baking cocoa

Line baking sheet with wax paper.

Place milk chocolate and semi-sweet morsels in large mixer bowl. Heat cream to a gentle boil in small saucepan; pour over morsels. Let stand for 1 minute; stir until smooth. Stir in peppermint extract. Cover with plastic wrap; refrigerate for 35 to 45 minutes or until slightly thickened. Stir just until color lightens slightly. (Do not overmix or truffles will be grainy)

Drop by rounded teaspoon onto prepared baking sheet; refrigerate for 10 to 15 minutes. Shape into balls; roll in walnuts or cocoa. Store in airtight container in refrigerator. Makes about 48 truffles.

Variation: After rolling chocolate mixture into balls; freeze for 30 to 40 minutes. Microwave 1 3/4 cups (11.5 oz pkg) milk chocolate morsels and 3 tablespoons vegetable shortening in medium, microwave-safe bowl on medium-high (70%) power for 1 minute; stir.

Microwave at additional 10 to 20 second intervals, stirring until smooth. Dip truffles into chocolate mixture; shake off excess. Place on foil-lined baking sheets.

Refrigerate for 15 to 20 minutes or until set. Store in airtight container in refrigerator.
