Candle Lighting Tips

- For perfect burning, trim the candle's wick to just the right length about 1/4 inch each time before you light it. Be sure to remove any wick debris in the candle before lighting, too.
- Don't touch, lift or move a burning candle; wait until the wax has cooled and hardened before you touch the candle itself.
- Candles should be kept away from extreme heat or cold, since candle wax can be temperature sensitive. Don't leave them in direct sunlight or other bright light for prolonged periods (the colors might fade).




Advantages To Fall Planting

You can plant anytime the ground isn't frozen and with normal care, your plants will be fine. The advantage to fall is cooler weather, pleasant for working outside, fall rains and a jump start for your plants next spring.

Just keep plants well watered until the ground freezes and they'll be fine over the winter. Most plants grow roots during fall and in the early

ASK IRIS!

Dear Iris:

I overheard two gardeners talking about "planting high" and I just couldn't believe it. What is the world coming to? Holly

Dear Holly:

No fear, they were referring to planting the crown of a plant (the place where roots begin) above the surrounding soil level. By doing this, it allows water to better drain away from the crown of perennial plants, avoiding rot, and trees and shrubs to spread their roots more naturally, just under the soil and preventing suffocation or poor development of these plants. It also allows for the buildup of some decaying matter from organic mulches which builds topsoil at the proper level for the plants.

Dear Iris:

I want to be more "natural" in my landscape. What should I do? Lily

Dear Lily:

I'm assuming tall, solid fences will not be in order here and you're wanting a landscape that is less formal, reflecting more of our natural surroundings. Avoid plants like Crimson King (red leaved) Maples, or Golden Locust and use native red maples (turns red in the fall), viburnums, deciduous hollies, ornamental grasses and perennials like coneflowers, false sunflower and blazing stars.

Dogwoods-good reds; Witchhazel-yellows, reds, oranges; Burning Bushes-red; Viburnums-red, yellows; Crab-yellows; Red or Yellow Twig Dogwoods-red, yellow stems and leaves; Boston Ivy-red; Carolina Allspice-yellow; Oakleaf Hydrangea-burgundy; Chokeburry-red and Beauty

Tips On Fall Mums

Lightly de-tangle the root ball, plant and water thoroughly. Remember to mulch and deadhead. Do not cut down your mum until spring. To keep

What's Cooking?

Zucchini Soup

1/2 C. chopped onion

1/2 C. chopped celery

1 clove garlic

5 chicken bouillon cubes

5 C. hot water

4 C. shredded zucchini

2 oz. long grain white rice or 1/4 C. instant rice

1 tsp. rosemary

1 tsp. thyme

Fresh parsley

3/4 oz. Parmesan cheese



Spray large saucepan with non-stick cooking spray. Over medium high heat, cook onion, celery & garlic until onion is translucent, about 2 min. Stir in chicken bouillon with hot water, zucchini & rice and bring to a boil.

Reduce heat to medium, cover partially and cook until rice is tender - 15 to 20 minutes.

Kitchen Tips

Cutting Board Care.

Always sterilize cutting boards after cutting raw or cooked meat or fish. For wood, soak 2 minutes in solution of 3 Tbsp. bleach per 1 gallon of water. Rinse and air dry.

What's The Difference?

- Espresso: Italian strong coffee, sipped.
- Latte: shot of Espresso with plenty of hot milk, not frothed.
- · Cappuccino: traditional coffee and milk mixed 50/50, topped by milk and a dusting of cin

Pretty Is As Pretty Does.

Add a little milk to the cooking water for cauliflower to keep its creamy white color.

You've Had It How Long?

You can keep Baking Powder or Baking Soda up to 18 months.

Save The Vitamins.

Since most US grown rice is enriched with a high vitamin coating, rinsing rice before cooking will wash away all the nutrients.

The Original Non-Stick.

Cast iron cookware is seasoned (or reseasoned after long use) by washing, drying, rubbing with vegetable oil and baking at 350 degrees for 1 hour.
