Flying In Style

As fall approaches, the leaves begin to turn colors, the temperature drops and the plants in the garden are fading fast. This is a perfect opportunity to bring color and enjoyment back into the garden. Bird and wildlife watching can be a relaxing, exhilarating and sometimes very comical experience.

If we have taken certain steps in our landscape, there may be some seeds available for birds to feast upon. Some seed producing plants are Ornamental Grasses, Coneflowers, Sunflowers, Phlox and Holly. If you want to speed up the birding experience, start feeding them with feeders.

There are many types of feeders available. Certain types of birds prefer certain types of feeders. In order to have a wide variety of birds, it is best to have a variety of different feeders. There are thistle feeders for finches, sunflower feeders for cardinals, suet feeders for woodpeckers, and platform feeders for blue jays.

You should also consider the ease of refilling your feeders when deter-

mining a location. If you need to shovel 50 feet of snow to refill a feeder, you are less likely to keep up it filled. Place the feeders where you can easily access them. Make it easy on yourself. Some temporary ways to place feeders are placing a shepard's hook in a heavy pot or attaching a shepherd's hook to a deck or pole secured with electrical ties.

Winter is a tough time for birds to find water. Most clean water is frozen and not accessible to them. If they do not have water, they cannot keep their body temperature regulated. One way to help them, is to provide a heated bird bath. Make sure your bird bath is not too deep (more than 1"). If it is, place stones or pea gravel in it to raise up the bottom surface. Your feathered friends will thank you.



CANDLE LIGHTING TIPS

- 1. For perfect burning, trim the candle's wick to just the right length-about 1/4 inch-each time before you light it. Be sure to remove any wick debris in the candle before lighting, too.
- 2. Don't touch, lift or move a burning candle; wait until the wax has cooled and hardened before you touch the candle itself.
- 3. Candles should be kept away from extreme heat or cold, since candle wax can be temperature-sensitive. Don't leave them in direct sunlight or other bright light for prolonged periods (the colors might fade).

Summer's almost gone, but it is not over. What should I be doing to extend my garden for Fall? I still want to enjoy it a little longer.

Dear Harvest,

Here are several different ideas to stretch the calendar a little. Try deadheading summer blooming perennials like Balloon Flower, Lobelia Cardinalis, Daylily, Black-Eyed-Susan and Stoke's Aster to encourage a rebloom period. By removing dried or dead blooms, often-times these plants will be stimulated into a second or third bloom late Summer or early Fall. Fall flowers like: Turtlehead (Chelone), tall Sedums, and tall garden Phlox usually will not rebloom if deadheaded. Leave the seed pods and foliage for Winter interest later on. Try shearing perennials that produce abundant blooms when the majority have faded, to save having to remove them one flower at a time. Dianthus and Coreopsis respond well to this technique, as do some annual flowers such as Marigolds and Vinca. Seissor cut or use small hedge shears to speed up the job.

Have fun this Fall! Give some thought to perking up your yard with Fall decorations, such as scarecrows, hay bales pumpkins and corn stalks. Try a novel way of arranging or stacking them too. Pumpkins can sit on top of one another to make a "tower" or even be painted or lettered to spell a phrase. Gather dried grasses and weed materials and put them in an unusual vase or garden container outside your door. Add silks, dried Fall flowers and brightly colored, novelty items to try something different. And don't forget to check the garden center for those unusual Fall bloomers like: Toadlily, Japanese Anemone, Turtlehead, Aster and Chrysanthemums. In a container, or in a garden bed, the add Fall interest to any area of the yard.

Pumpkin Pie Pudding

15 oz can pumpkin

12 oz can evaporated milk

3.4 c sugar

 $\frac{1}{2}$ c biscuit baking mix

2 eggs, beaten


2 tbsp butter, melted

2 ½ tsp pumpkin pie spice2 tsp vanilla extract

garnish: whipped cream



In a bowl, mix together all ingredients except topping. Transfer to a slow cooker that has been sprayed with non-stick vegetable spray. Cover and cook on low setting for $3\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 hours. Pudding will swart to pull away from sides of slow cooker; test for doneness with a toothpick inserted in center. Serve warm, topped with dollops of whipped cream. Makes 4 to 6 servings.
