Sustainable Gardening At Linton's Enchanted Gardens

At Linton's Enchanted Gardens, we educate our customers about sustainable gardening. According to Mark B. Linton, President, "at Linton's, we practice what we preach." A sustainable garden works in harmony with nature. We start with planting native plants and trees. This is one of the best ways to work with, rather than against, nature. We suggest growing plant species that are native to our area. In return, they will be healthier than exotic species.

Another suggestion Linton recommends is back yard composting. Composting is a method of returning organic waste back into a nutrient rich soil amendment. This compost improves the plant health by supplying nutrients to the soil. According to Mark, the firm has probably the area's largest compost pile located at their Nursery facility in Bristol. "We compost everything." It's great as a soil amendment and we use it not only in our growing operations at our Nursery, but in our landscape installations as well!"

Organic gardening is probably one of the fastest growing trends we are seeing. We offer the area's largest selection of organic fertilizers at our Garden Centre.

Mulching is another sustainable gardening tip from Linton. "Mulch protects the soil by helping it retain moisture. It's also great for suppressing weeds and insulating plants from extreme temperatures.

Another suggestion Mark recommends is "double digging". Double digging helps the soil hold more water, improves aeration and places organic material at a depth that enables plant roots to adequately extend. By adding your own compost and double digging, you are actually growing the soil.

A new trend with irrigation systems is the use of small spray emitters or drip irrigation. These new systems direct the water to the plant's roots and don't just spray over the entire area while wasting precious water. "At our plant nursery, we utilize a lot of drip irrigation as well as reclaim irrigation water at both our Nursery and Garden Centre locations.

Many of us learned in grade school that plants take in carbon dioxide and emit oxygen, allowing us to breathe. But there are many other reasons why we should plant more trees. They also clean up other pollutants like ozone, carbon monoxide and sulfur dioxide and this is a wonderful thing.

Did you know that, under trees, dew and frost tend to be less than the surrounding areas because less radiant energy is released from the soil, creating a micro-climate. This protects your landscape from the late spring and early fall frost, giving you a slightly longer gardening season.

Planting trees around your home can keep your energy costs down. In summer, the canopy of the trees shades your home, keeping it cooler and warmer in winter by providing a wind break. Trees help reduce water problems near your home. They intercept water by storing some of it and helping to reduce storm runoff. They also help to reduce noise pollution. If you live near a noisy area, trees can really be one of your best friends.

There are also health benefits to having trees. Most of us respond to trees simply by observing their beauty. It makes us feel serene, peaceful and restful. This can help reduce blood pressure and stress levels. Observing and caring for our outdoor environment also gets us some much needed exercise.

Because of a trees long life, they are frequently used as memorials or to mark a special occasion like the birth of a child, a wedding date or even to christen a new home. Watching and nurturing this type of tree we often become emotionally attached to it. This makes the spot where we planted our tree, a very special place that we will treasure for many years.

With most lawn grasses, the spots should grow in over time, though reseeding is a quicker solution. The best long-term solution is to train your dog to use an out-of-the-way area. Dietary supplements intended to make dog urine less potent are available, but you should consult a veterinarian before using one.

GOING PONDLESS

What is pondless? Pondless is a term that we use where we design a water feature that does not have a pond. At Linton's, we are seeing this as a growing trend.

Why build a pondless water feature? In a word "maintenance". I think it has to do with lifestyles. People are busier and they don't want to spend time doing maintenance. The ponds that we design and install aren't considered high maintenance, but they do require some work. There is also the safety factor involved with having a pond where young children could fall. With pondless features, we bury the small water reservoir into the ground, putting our homeowner's minds at ease.

Most of our clients are interested in features that combine the sound of running water with low maintenance. The up-front costs are a little less than a pond which also makes it more attractive to our customers. The price range for pondless features that we build are \$1,000 - \$10,000 depending upon the size and features desired. We even have kits for our do-it-yourself customers which start out at \$500. The majority of the pondless features that we build also include landscape plantings and the average cost of these are in the \$5 -6,000 range.

Pondless waterfalls also are easier to fit in the growing number of small backyards. A pondless waterfall doesn't take up all the space that a pond does. We are also seeing a trend with corporations who have begun requesting the features as part of "contemplative gardens" where employees spend time during breaks. They can listen and watch the trickling water while surrounded by beautiful flowering plants, trees and shrubs. It provides a nice "escape" for the employees.

These pondless water features are excellent for those who want to create birdwatching opportunities. These features do a great job of attracting wildlife. Divots in the stones create pools where birds drink and bathe. Installing one last fall for a client, we drilled holes through a huge monster boulder. It was all that our bobcat tractor could handle. It has done a great job of attracting birds for our client. They love it and have even named the boulder "Rocky".

What's Cooking?

Berry Poppy Seed Salad

3 tbsp salad oil

3 tbsp honey

1 tbsp vinegar

1 tsp poppy seed

½ tsp prepared mustard

4 c torn Bibb or Boston lettuce

2 c sliced strawberries or strawberries and blueberries*

1 small onion, thinly sliced and separated into rings

For dressing, in a small bowl combine salad oil, honey, vinegar, poppy seed, and mustard. Mix well. In a large salad bowl combine lettuce, berries, and onion. Toss with dressing. Makes 4 servings.

*When strawberries aren't available, refreshing green kiwi fruit is a delightful substitute in this salad. For 2 cups, peel and slice four kiwi fruit.
